



# Book Club Questions

## Immortal Grit

Here are some questions for kick-starting book club discussions:

- What is the significance of the title? What does the title mean to you?
- Which recurring themes did you notice throughout the book?
- Which character (Brooke or Hannah) resonated most with you and why?
- What did you think was the turning point in the story for Brooke? What about for Hannah?
- How important was the yellow house to the story?
- How did each character see the house?
- What feelings did this book evoke for you?

Did the book broaden your perspective about any societal issues? If so, which ones?

Did the book inspire you in any way? If so, how?

How did female friendships contribute to the story? Did any of the female friends in the book remind you of any of your own friendships?

The author attempted to make belief in the supernatural an optional part of reading *Immortal Grit*. Do you think there actually was a spirit or supernatural presence in Brooke's house? Or do you think there were perfectly logical reasons for the events in the house?

What do you think happened to Brooke after the story ended? What about Hannah?
